NORTH TYNESIDE COUNCIL

PROCEDURE FOR VIRTUAL HEARING OF AN APPLICATION BEFORE THE LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE ("the Committee")

The four licensing objectives, as set out in the Licensing Act 2003, are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm.

Each application that comes before this Committee will be treated on its own merits, and this Licensing Authority will take its decision based upon:

- The merits of the application
- The promotion of the four licensing objectives
- The Statement of Licensing Policy of North Tyneside Council
- The guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

The Procedure of the Committee is as follows:

- The Chair of the Committee will open the hearing and will ask all persons involved in the hearing to identify themselves in turn. The Chair will then explain the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2. The Committee will then consider any request made by a party under regulation 8(2) of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 for permission for a person to participate as a witness on his/her behalf.
- 3. The Licensing Officer will present a report to the Committee outlining the application, any relevant representations and the relevant sections of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the statutory guidance.
- 4. The Members of the Committee may ask any relevant questions they have of the Licensing Officer.
- 5. The Applicant will then be invited to address the Committee to clarify any information arising from the officer's report, if necessary.
- 6. Any of the Other Persons may ask any relevant questions they have of the Licensing Officer.
- 7. Each of the Other Persons who have made representations will be invited to address the Committee about the application, indicating why they consider the issues they

have raised to be relevant to the licensing objectives and sufficient to object to the application or notice (as applicable).

If any Other Person has obtained prior permission to call a particular witness, then they may call that witness.

<u>Note</u>: In order to avoid repetition and to expedite proceedings at the hearing, objectors within the same group of Other Persons are encouraged to appoint an agreed spokesperson to address the Committee.

- 8. The Committee may ask any relevant questions they have of the Other Persons or their witness(es).
- 9. The Applicant may ask any relevant questions of the Other Persons or their witness(es).
- 10. The Applicant will be invited to address the Committee, in relation to their application. If the Applicant has obtained prior permission to call a particular witness, then they may call that witness.
- 11. The Committee may ask any relevant questions they have of the Applicant or their witness(es)
- 12. The Chair will invite each of the Other Persons to make a brief closing statement. Each of the Other Persons will be entitled to a maximum of 10 minutes in which to make their closing statements.
- 13. The Chair will invite the Applicant to make a brief closing statement, ideally taking no longer than 10 minutes.
- 14. The Chair will ask all parties if they are satisfied that they have said all they wish to.
- 15. The Committee will retire in private to consider the application and make its determination. The Legal Adviser will be present to ensure that all matters of law, evidence and procedure are adhered to appropriately but will not take part in the decision.
- 16. In considering any representations or a notice made by any party, the Committee may take into account documentary or other information produced by a party in support of their application, representations or notice (as the case may be) either before the hearing or, with the consent of all the other parties, at the hearing.
- 17. The Committee shall disregard any information given by a party or by any person to whom permission to appear at the hearing is given by the Committee, which is not relevant to:
 - (i) their application, representations or a notice (as the case may be) or, in the case of another person, the application, representations or notice of the party requesting their attendance; and

- (ii) the promotion of the licensing objectives or, in relation to a hearing to consider a notice given by a chief officer of police, the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective.
- NB Parties are reminded that any documentary or other information or evidence they wish to produce in support of their application or representation must have been disclosed to all parties prior to the hearing taking place. Late representations, documents or evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties present.
- 18. A written notice of the decision will be provided to all parties in accordance with statutory requirements. The decision letter will include the reasons for the decision, and any conditions placed upon the licence (if granted) and the licensing objective(s) they relate to. The notification of decision will include information on a party's right to appeal against the Committee's decision.

General Matters

1. Expectations on parties

The Licensing Authority expects all parties to a hearing to endeavour to address any issues openly and to work towards an amicable resolution, if at all possible, prior to the hearing taking place.

All parties will be expected to:

- (i) demonstrate which of the four licensing objectives are addressed in relation to each of the issues they wish to raise at the hearing; and
- (ii) draw to the Committee's attention any relevant aspects of the National Guidance or local Statement of Licensing Policy which they also consider are particularly relevant to the Committee's consideration of the issues the party(ies) has/have raised.

2. Agreement that a hearing is unnecessary

A Licensing Authority can dispense with holding a hearing if all persons concerned (applicants and parties raising a representation) give notice to the Licensing Authority prior to the hearing date that they consider it unnecessary.

Where all such persons have given such notice, and the Licensing Authority agrees that a hearing is unnecessary, the Licensing Authority will give notice to the parties that the hearing has been dispensed with.

3. Failure of parties to attend

The hearing may proceed in the absence of any party who has informed the Licensing Authority that they do not intend to attend or be represented at the virtual hearing.

If a party fails to attend or be represented at a virtual hearing without notifying the Licensing Authority, the Committee may adjourn the hearing to a specific date if it considers it to be in the public interest to do so, or alternatively may proceed with the hearing in the party's absence. In the interests of the other parties, costs and

efficiency, hearings will generally proceed notwithstanding the absence of any party (including the Applicant).

Where it is decided to proceed in a party's absence, all notices and representations received from the absent party will be considered by the Committee.

If, in exceptional circumstances, a decision is made to adjourn a hearing all parties will be advised of the date, time and venue (if any) to which the hearing has been adjourned.

4. Questioning of parties

The Licensing Authority will generally allow all parties to ask questions of another party present, but this decision will be taken on a case by case basis and in some exceptional circumstances (a reason will be given) cross examination may be prohibited.

5. Further clarification

When addressing the Committee each party shall respond specifically to any points of which it received notice (with the Notice of Hearing) upon which the Committee was seeking clarification.

6. Questioning by Legal Adviser

The legal adviser to the Committee may ask questions on behalf of, or in addition to, the Committee members themselves.

7. Hearsay evidence

Hearsay evidence will be admissible provided that it is relevant. The weight to be attributed to hearsay evidence will be a matter for the Committee.

8. Persons behaving in a disruptive manner

The Committee has the right to exclude any person disrupting the hearing, at their discretion. The Committee can refuse to allow that person to return or, alternatively, may permit him/her to return on such conditions as the Committee may decide. Any person required to leave the hearing may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the Committee in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

9. No decision-making by Ward Members

A member of the Licensing Committee shall not be entitled to participate in any decision-making in relation to any licensing application concerning premises in the Ward for which he/she serves as Councillor.

1.0 Summary / Purpose of Report

Licensing Sub-Committee

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 ("The Act") provides that, where representations have been received from a Responsible Authority or Other Parties in respect on an application for the variation of a Premises Licence, a hearing must be held to consider such applications, unless the parties and the Authority agree that a hearing can be dispensed with. Licensing Sub-Committees have therefore been established in accordance with the provisions of the Act for the purpose of hearing applications such as this.
- 1.2 The Sub-Committee is asked to consider and determine an application from Mr Shawn Darling-Cooper for the variation of a Premises Licence in relation to Kork, 74 Whitley Road, Whitley Bay, NE26 2NE ("The Premises").
- 1.3 Mr Darling-Cooper has been invited to attend the meeting in support of his application. All persons making relevant representations have also been invited to attend.

1.4 Representations from Responsible Authorities and Other Persons

The application has been forwarded to the Chief Officer of Police, Fire Authority, Local Planning Authority, Environmental Health Authority, Health and Safety Enforcement Agency, Licensing Authority, Director of Public Health, Weights and Measures Authority, Home Office Immigration Enforcement and the North Tyneside Safeguarding Children Partnership (formerly the Local Safeguarding Children Board), with a view to any of these Responsible Authorities inspecting the premises if deemed appropriate by them and to enable them to comment on the application.

The application has been advertised at the premises, in a local newspaper and also, on the Council Website as prescribed.

There have been no representations received from any of the Responsible Authorities.

Representations have been received from other parties and are appended to this report at **Appendix 4**. A petition of 19 signatures against this application has also been received and the person who submitted this petition was issued with a Notice of Hearing.

A total of 342 e-mails of support to this application were also received via North Tyneside Council's public access portal, and of these, 12 representations were considered relevant to the licensing objectives, and have been issued with a Notice of Hearing.

1.5 Authority to make decision

In relation to an Application for the Variation of a Premises Licence, the Licensing Sub-Committee can, in accordance with section 35(4) of the Licensing Act 2003:

- Modify the conditions of the licence; or,
- Reject the whole or part of the application.

Once the Sub-Committee has reached a decision, the decision and reasons for the decision must be given in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 and the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

2.0 Background

2.1 This report relates to an application for the Variation of an existing Premises Licence in respect of Kork, 74 Whitley Road, Whitley Bay, NE26 2NE

The current Premises Licence permits the following licensable activities and times:

Supply of Alcohol (for consumption **off** the premises only)

Monday to Saturday	09.00 – 21.00
 Sunday 	10.00 – 16.00

General Opening Times

•	Monday to Saturday	09.00 – 21.00
•	Sunday	10.00 – 16.00

- The current licence is attached to the report at **Appendix 3.** The licence provides for the supply of alcohol for consumption **off** the premises only and does not permit the supply of alcohol for consumption **on** the Premises. The 'premises' is the area indicated at Annex 4 of the licence.
- 2.3 The Application for the variation of a Premises Licence is made under Section 34 of The Licensing Act 2003 and the Section of the Act dealing with the determination of such an application is Section 35.
- 2.4 Mr Darling-Cooper seeks to vary the licence by having included in the licence, the following days and times:-

Supply of Alcohol (for consumption **on** the premises)

Every Day	12.00 – 22.00	

General Opening Times

Monday to Saturday	09.00 – 22.00
 Sunday 	10.00 – 22.00

Mr Darling -Cooper has also requested a seasonal variation to offer outside seating of up to 3 tables in the warmer months. These tables have been marked on the updated plan attached at **Appendix 2**

The sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises will remain the same times as outlined in paragraph 2.1 above.

A copy of the application for the variation of the Premises Licence is attached at Appendix 1 and an updated plan of the premises and map of the area is attached at Appendix 2.

It may be noted from the application form that additional times for sale of alcohol are outlined in box 'J – Supply of Alcohol' and comments are also included below box L "Please identify those conditions currently imposed on the licence which you believe could be removed as a consequence of the proposed variation you are seeking." The applicant has confirmed these entries were completed in error. The applicant has provided an explanation in an e-mail that is attached at **Appendix 6**.

2.6 If the licence is granted, this will be subject to Mandatory Conditions which are attached at **Appendix 5** of the report.


Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. A CCTV system will be designed, installed and maintained in proper working order to the reasonable satisfaction of and in consultation with Northumbria Police and the Licensing Authority. Such a system shall:-
- (i) Be operated by properly trained staff.
- (ii) Provide continuous recording facilities for each camera to a good standard of clarity.
- (iii) Be retained on disk or otherwise.
- (iv) Ensure coverage of the entrance to the Licensed Premises, both internally and externally.
- (v) Ensure coverage of such other areas as may be required by Northumbria Police and Licensing Authority in consultation with the Licence holder.
- (vi) Ensure recordings are retained for a period of 28 days and will be supplied to the Licensing Authority or Northumbria Police representative on request.
- 2. Signs are to be placed both internally and externally and the Premises indicating to customers that CCTV is in operation on the Premises. Signs are to be a minimum of A5 size.
- 3. A member of staff is to be trained in the operation of the CCTV system and be able to download the images on request.
- 4. All members of staff responsible for serving alcohol at the Premises shall seek credible photographic proof of age evidence from any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years and who is seeking to purchase alcohol. - 5. All members of staff will have adequate training on the Licensing Act 2003 and any subsequent variation of the Act. This training will be delivered every 6 months for current staff and will be provided to any new member of staff. The training will be delivered by a personal licence holder. The training will be documented and kept on file for the inspection of a Trading Standards Officers, Licensing Authority Officers or Police representatives on request.
- 6. The Designated Premises Supervisor is to provide written authorisation to all staff involved in the sale of alcohol. Such authorisation is to be retained as part of the staff training records.
- 7. A refusals register (electronic or paper based) is to be kept and maintained on the Premises. This register shall be supplied promptly to a Police representative, Trading Standards Officer or Licensing Authority Officer on request.
- 8. No open bottles or drinks containers are to leave the Premises.

Our objection going forward from the draft letter we received from Councillor John O'Shea which advised that he had been contacted by Shawn Darling-Cooper who had indicated the following:

- Drinking on the outside tables would not be allowed after 8:00 pm
- There would be no external music
- The premises would only be open Wednesday until Sunday.

The first point above about not being allowed to drink outside after 8:00pm indicates that they can drink inside until after this time.

On the second point about being no external music. The noise expected from people leaving the premises after 10:00pm at night is probably going to be more of an issue.

On the third point about the premises being open Wednesday until Sundays. Our concerns are that once a licence is made and agreed for 7 days a week for times indicated up to 10pm how are the local residents guaranteed that either Mr Darling-Cooper or a future owner/lessee of the business premises won't change their business strategy.

The licence applied for will not show the changes as in the indications above and this would make it much harder for residents to object in the future if Mr Darling-Cooper decides to change how often and how late the shop is open to sell alcohol on the premises if the licence is granted on how it has currently been applied for.

It may be cynical but we would imagine most businesses would try to maximise profits and this could mean that Kork's could slowly be opened more often and to later times of night.

This is not an objection to small businesses in this area as there are others based here but to the type of business that Kork's will be.

For residents who have children who play along this stretch of path these plans I think would restrict how parents would allow them to use this area if a business of this type is allowed.

As previously indicated, we do think that this will impact on the local residents due to noise levels particularly if people are sitting outside the shop premises or leaving after 10:00pm at night. No matter how good people's intentions are it is highly unlikely that once people have had a couple of alcoholic beverages that they would be able to keep noise levels down. The block of flats facing Kork's all have bedrooms facing these businesses so this could impact those residents most.

I also think that Mr Darling-Cooper rather than drumming up support via Instagram could have made his plans known to the residents in the immediate area before deciding to apply for a change to the alcohol licence especially as a lot of people would not know how to use Instagram or other media like this.

Most residents here didn't even realise that there had been an application of this type made. If you didn't read the small notice in the bottom left-hand side of the window then there was no other communication given to the local community.

All Mr Darling-Cooper's friends and family are obviously going to support him on Instagram but at the end of the day this will not be on their doorstep and I think consideration should be given to residents and their concerns as the majority of people who will visit Kork's will live further afield.

After all the years of complaints about the South Parade area the worry is that if this business is granted permission for an extended alcohol licence to sell on premises until this time of night, it will open a precedent for future applications in this area.

We hope you take these objections into consideration before coming to any decision.

I am highly against the shop being open seven days a week and particularly them wanting to be open until 10 pm every day. This is unreasonable and shows a complete disregard for what is a residential area. Another major concern is them proposing to have tables outside. This would generate anti-social behaviour and unwelcome noise. I live directly opposite the shop with my mother, whose bedroom is at the front of the property. Most evenings she is in bed before 9.00 pm and sleeps with her window open. She leaves for work before 6.30 am. I am writing in connection with the above application and to advise you that I strongly object to the plans of Kork Wine. It is completely unreasonable for them to want to trade until 10.00 pm seven nights a week. This part of Whitley Road has always been a quiet residential area and their wish to be open so late is not in keeping with the few other adjacent shops that close at 5.00 pm (with the exception of Splinters that closes on occasion slightly later once or twice a week). This part of Whitley Road is the opposite of where there are numerous restaurants and takeaways further along the road.

I am also strongly opposed to them wanting tables outside in the warmer months. All of the properties on my side of the road have bedrooms that face onto the street. If I have my windows open and people walk past talking, I can often make out what they are saying. I (and other residents) do not want multiple people sitting opposite drinking on the street. This would cause noise pollution and would be made worse by people getting rowdier due to drinking and most likely result in anti social behaviour. There is a concern that if tables were allowed on the street, drinking could continue after 10 pm if a round of drinks has been ordered in the last fifteen or twenty minutes of trading. As a keyworker, I often have to go to bed early and I know I would be greatly disturbed by the breach of my peace directly over the road from my property which would prevent me from sleeping.

It will not be opening late and will not cater for customers who will be drinking heavily. Their business is founded on the appreciation of good wine and I don't believe that offering their

customers a glass of wine will have any negative social issues for the area. Other areas of Whitley Bay have successfully managed to open licensed premises

alongside residential properties. The residents along park view and the adjacent side streets have no issue with

much larger licensed premises than Kork.

APPENDIX 5

Mandatory Conditions

Section 19 Licensing Act 2003

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:-
- (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence

Or

- (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under this premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a licence.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 - with effect from 1st April 2010 as amended on 1st October 2014

- 1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014 – with effect from 28th May 2014

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a)"duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i)the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
