


New businesses surviving for one year after being started






Satisfaction with sports and leisure facilities 2021 61%




Satisfaction with library facilities









Proportion of visitors to North Tyneside who were satisfied
















Local authority managed roads where maintenance should be considered - non-principal





Proportion of residents satisfied with road maintenance











Gap between disadvantaged pupils and their peers reaching the expected level at Foundation Stage





Children who received a 2-2½ year ASQ-3 review Children meeting the expected level in all 5 areas of the ASQ-3




Gap between disadvantaged pupils and their peers reaching the expected level at Foundation Stage




