Thank you for your email and apologise that I have not responded sooner but I have been on leave recently.

The ash tree is located within a conservation area so if it is intended to undertake any works to a tree, notification to the Local Planning Authority would normally be made via a section 211 notice.

In this case, your planning application for development in a conservation area acted as a section 211 notice in that the application included specific works to the ash tree. On checking the application, the information you submitted about the tree was based on my comments to the planning officer, however, the application was approved with conditions that only required compliance, not information to be submitted. Nor did the granting of approval provide adequate protection of the tree.

On this basis the council has a duty to assess the tree to see if it merits further protection by way of a TPO. Based on earlier responses and inspections it was concluded that the Ash tree provides a high level of amenity to the surrounding public area ar its removal will have a detrimental impact on the conservation area. Therefore, a decision was made to protect the tree with a temporary Tree Preservation Order.
